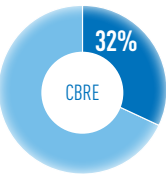


LEASING

Certainly not feeling blue

The surprise boost in Q3 take-up has caused ripples in EG's letting agents' league table, where the polite chair shifting between heavyweights CBRE, Jones Lang LaSalle and DTZ within the top five places has been disturbed by Colliers International. The consultancy (which placed outside the top 25 in Q2) muscled into the number five spot this quarter, with a market share of around 10%. The boost was courtesy of its joint agency instruction on the Shard's little brother, The Place, home of this quarter's largest letting, the 430,000 sq ft prelet to News UK.

Undisputed king of the quarter, however, was CBRE, which pushed JLL off the top spot, handling over 1.3m sq ft of disposals, 500,000 sq ft more than its nearest rival.



Bluebook has also caused a stir, dashing up the charts in Q3. The West End specialist, formed by ex-JLL directors Chris Watkin and Joe Fuller in 2013, parachuted into the number eight slot, thanks to the joint agency letting to Ogilvy & Mather at Sea Containers House, SE1. Not bad going for a company that only launched in April.

It was all change at the other end of the table too, with five of the lowest ranked firms last quarter dropping out of sight in Q3. Surprisingly, these were familiar names such as Ingleyby Trice and Gerald Eve.

Some of their replacements, including Newton Perkins and Anton Page, jumped into higher positions than their predecessors. James Andrew International fared well, jostling into 17th place on the back of involvement in a single deal: as joint agent on the subletting of 87,000 sq ft at Riverbank House, EC4.

AGENTS BY SUBMARKET

CBRE dominated leasing instructions across central London in Q3. It was the only firm to make the top five in all six submarkets, coming top of the pack in two of them. One of those was the South Bank, where, unsurprisingly, four of the five leading agents were the ones involved in

the quarter's headline-grabbing deals at The Place and Sea Containers House.

However, the big boys were pushed down the pecking order in the City fringes, where niche agencies made the podium finishes in Q3.
